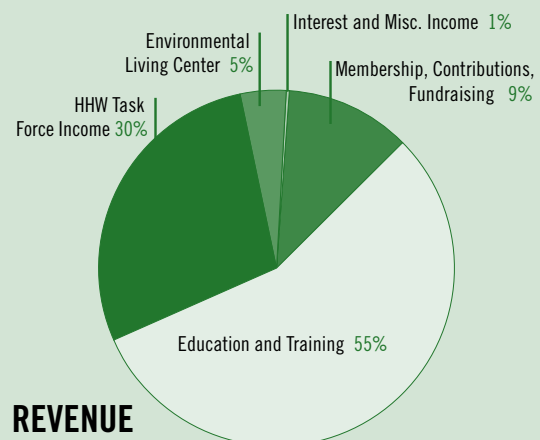

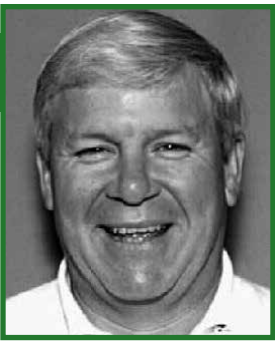

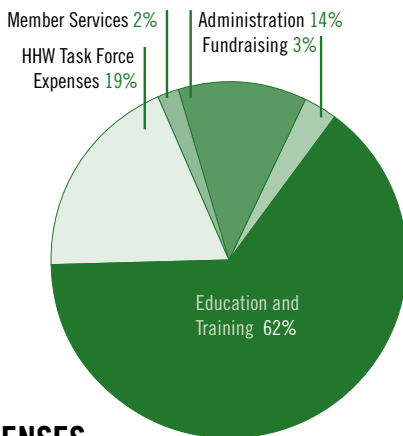
At PRC's Annual Dinner in November, keynote speaker Richard Allan, PA DCNR Secretary, spoke about the importance of recycling in Pennsylvania. How since the passage of PA Act 101 in 1988 recycling has become a major environmental and economic driver in the Commonwealth, saving natural resources while creating jobs and contributing millions of dollars to the local economy. Other dinner highlights included Dorothy Hermani receiving the Fox-Calhoun award for her 50 plus years of volunteering, PPL Energy Plus for Community Service, Greenstar for Sustainability, Marcal Manufacturing, LLC for Conservation, and Judy Archibald, M.Ed. for her contributions to Environmental Education.

Other successful initiatives in 2011 included energy reduction programs and tailgate recycling in both Pittsburgh and Philadelphia, including at the NHL's 2011 Winter Classic. PRC also coordinated collections for e-waste, household chemicals, pharmaceuticals and other hard to recycle materials. These collections provided thousands of Pennsylvanians with cost effective convenient disposal options while diverting hundreds of thousands of pounds of materials from the waste stream. Scenic Pittsburgh fought visual blight, hosted a national conference and successfully advocated for legislation regulating electronic billboards in Pittsburgh, in addition to being instrumental in removing an illegal billboard in downtown Pittsburgh.

PRC's core Environmental Educational Programs were also in strong demand during the year with EITC funding and private grants making it possible for us to reach over ten thousand school children across the state.

As PRC looks forward to continuing to meet the challenges and achieve the successes aimed at fulfilling our mission in 2012 and beyond, I remind you that it is only through the generosity and support of people like you that we are able to do the work that we do!

## WINTER CLASSIC FANS EMBRACED TAILGATE RECYCLING IN PITTSBURGH

Western office staff started the New Year collecting recyclables from tailgating hockey fans before the 2011 Bridgestone NHL Winter Classic. Their efforts resulted in the diversion of nearly 2 tons of aluminum cans, glass containers and plastic bottles and cups from the landfill.

## STEELERS FANS RECYCLED OVER 14 MILES OF ALUMINUM CANS!

Fueled by the phenomenal success of the 2010 campaign, "Let's Tackle Recycling" expanded to EVERY Steelers regular season home game in 2011. Tailgating fans filled up blue bags with recyclables and the "Let's Tackle Recycling" crew gathered more than 22,000 pounds of cans, bottles, plastic containers and cardboard in Heinz Field parking lots.

## EAGLES FANS "RECYCLED-A-LOT"

PRC East's "Recycle-A-Lot" Tailgate Recycling Program was launched at all Philadelphia Eagles 2011 home games. Participation from thousands of enthusiastic Eagles fans allowed PRC and partners to divert over 64,000 pounds of aluminum cans, glass bottles, plastic containers, and cardboard packaging from the waste stream for recycling.

## LICENSE PLATE REMINDS MOTORISTS NOT TO LITTER

PRC introduced its "Don't Be A Litterbug" specialty license plate in 2011. "Don't Be A Litterbug" license plates cost \$45 each, and a portion of the proceeds from every plate sold will go toward community cleanup and beautification efforts statewide. ## PRC'S EDMONT FARMERS' MARKET

The eastern office launched their first Farmers' Market in July at PRC's Environmental Living Center in Ridley Creek State Park, Edgmont, Delaware County. The Farmers' Market brings fresh local, chemical-free fruits and vegetables to many neighboring communities. The publicity and exposure highlighted our organization and the programs we provide, and gave us the opportunity to demonstrate our mission to the community.

## EARTH DAY CONTEST WINNERS RECEIVED A "GREEN HOME MAKEOVER"

Matt & Katie Betler of Pittsburgh won PRC's first-ever "Green Home Makeover" contest and were treated to delivery and installation of a prize package worth over \$1,000. The contest was part of PRC West and partners Earth Day 2011 Green Lifestyles Expo and the makeover featured 'green' items for both inside and outside the home.

## PRC EAST LAUNCHED AN E-WASTE RECYCLING PROGRAM IN SE PA

In response to new demand for conveniently located and scheduled recycling events generated by PA Act 108, PRC east launched an e-waste recycling program and collected 65,000 pounds of e-waste during 12 free collections in Delaware, Chester and Bucks counties.

## PECO SMART IDEAS® PROGRAM SAVED ENERGY AND MONEY

Through the PECO Smart Ideas® contract, PRC provides community education and outreach to promote residential energy conservation programs. The programs are designed to reduce overall electricity demand 3% by May, 2013 as required by PA Act 129. Community

outreach efforts and effective advertising enabled PECO to achieve energy demand reductions well above the interim goal of 1% by May 2011 and, in addition, PECO customers saved over \$131 million in energy costs.

## SCENIC PITTSBURGH FOUGHT VISUAL BLIGHT AND HOSTED A NATIONAL CONFERENCE

In November, Scenic Pittsburgh hosted the 2011 Scenic America annual conference. and over 40 representatives from affiliates across the country were surprised and impressed by Pittsburgh's scenic views and historic architecture. The conference featured the experts and community leaders responsible for Pittsburgh's transformation from industrial city to world-class scenic destination. As the public voice for the public space, Scenic Pittsburgh successfully advocated for legislation restricting electronic billboards across the city and the removal of an illegal billboard in Downtown Pittsburgh.

## BILLBOARD CONTROL

PRC East was influential in the reintroduction of Legislative Bills to control billboards in Pennsylvania and helped form a group called "Preserve Our Pennsylvania Towns" to focus on the billboard issues facing the Delaware County towns of Marple, Newtown, Springfield, Haverford and Morton.

# Education

## ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH IN-SCHOOL CURRICULUM

PRC west presented its Environmental Health program to over 1,000 middle and high school students in SW PA. The program teaches students how & where they come into contact with environmental toxins each day, and offers solutions such as non-toxic alternatives they can use to avoid exposure and live healthier lives.

## EITC

Funding received through Pennsylvania's Environmental Improvement Tax Credit (EITC) program allowed PRC to present 84 environmental education programs free of charge to 2,213 public school students in 2011. These programs were made possible through generous funding from: Waste Management, Customers Bank, Wawa, and PNC Bank.

## MEDICINE DISPOSAL AND YOU!

PRC East staff conducted 6 presentations of the "Medicine Disposal and You!" program to nearly 600 senior citizens, which marked the highest level of attendance since the program began in 2008. The program teaches individuals how to properly dispose of unused or expired medications without harming the environment and was funded by the Environmental Fund for Pennsylvania.

## EXELON'S FAIRLESS HILLS RENEWABLE ENERGY EDUCATION CENTER

As the provider of educational programming at Exelon's Renewable Energy Education Center in Fairless Hills, PA, PRC presented 26 programs at the center to over 900 students in 2011. Opened in 2008, the Education Center features a variety of interactive displays to spark students' interest in how electricity is created using renewable resources.

## CENTRAL PA

Thanks to generous funding from Exelon and The Hershey Company, PRC was able to provide valuable environmental education programming, free of charge, to 2,232 students in Central Pennsylvania in 2011. Staff presented 87 interactive environmental education programs on topics such as water conservation, litter and recycling, alternative energy, and living a greener lifestyle.

## WATERSHED EDUCATION FOR PENNSYLVANIA STUDENTS

Funding from the Allegheny County Conservation District, the PA EITC program, Dominion Foundation, the Pittsburgh Children's Museum and an Environmental Education grant from the PA DEP, enabled PRC to provide 88 free, in-school watershed awareness classes to 1,180 elementary and middle school students in Allegheny, Lackawanna and Luzerne counties in 2011.

## FAMILIES WORKING TOGETHER FOR THE WATERSHED

This unique workshop targeted families in the Pittsburgh area and offered education forums that provided basic watershed information and protective actions designed to engage residents of all ages and socio-economic strata. The workshop highlighted the need to conserve and preserve this precious natural resource and offered solutions to watershed and water quality problems.

# Business and Collaborations

## "ZIP CERTIFICATION" FOR BUSINESSES AND INSTITUTIONS

After extraordinary participation in waste reduction certification from 2010 special events, Zero Waste Pittsburgh turned its focus toward businesses, institutions and other large waste generators in 2011. The rebranded waste certification, now known as the ZIP, became available in two categories; Special Events and Businesses & Institutions. ZIP is a great opportunity for organizations to take incremental steps to increase their waste diversion and to publicize their commitment to the environment.

## MAKING COMPOST WHERE IT'S NEEDED MOST

With the help of PRC West, two neighboring farmers in Beaver County received permits from DEP to compost a wide range of waste on their farms. The composting-farm-cluster strategy promises environmental and economic advantages over landfilling and more centralized organic waste management. In November, PRC was awarded a two-year grant from the U.S. Dept of Agriculture to build the Beaver cluster, to help launch a second in Lawrence County, a third in Fayette County.

## ACHIEVE ZERO WASTE WITH ONE CLICK

PRC launched its newly redesigned Zero Waste Pittsburgh website ([www.zerowastepgh.org](http://www.zerowastepgh.org)) with added features for both commercial and residential users. The site is now truly a one-stop shop and provides information on everything from waste audits & certifications for businesses, institutions and special events to household chemical, pharmaceutical and e-waste collections for individuals.

## DIY ZERO WASTE FOR SPECIAL EVENTS

Zero Waste Recycling Kits, aka 'Zip Kits', were introduced in 2011 for individuals looking to make their birthday party, family picnic or tailgating event less wasteful. Recycling and composting collection containers, bags and signs became available in no cost and low cost packages, depending on the size and needs of the event.

## HARD TO RECYCLE COLLECTIONS RECAP

In 2011, more than 1,500 participants recycled 78 tons of electronics (including 1,900 lbs. of batteries), nearly 500 CFLs and 700 tires in SW PA! PRC also partnered with local reuse organizations to give a second life to 2,100 lbs. of building materials, more than 100 different medical supplies, 220 lbs. of clothing and over 40 tote bags.

## HOUSEHOLD CHEMICAL AND PHARMACEUTICAL COLLECTIONS

The Household Chemical and Pharmaceutical Collections Program sponsored 7 HHW collections in 6 western PA counties in 2011, serving over 3,000 households and collecting nearly 260,000 pounds of materials. In addition, PRC partnered with the Drug Enforcement Administration's (DEA) regional office to help expand and market their National Drug Take Back Day Collections. The partnership resulted in the safe disposal of 16,800 lbs of medications during the spring and fall Drug Take Back Day collection events in SW PA.
